Solving Friendship Problems: How parents and carers can help

Children develop friendship skills through playing with other children.

Because children are learning, they are sure to have times when things do not go as they would like. Sometimes they blame themselves for what has happened. They may say, "Nobody likes me 'coz I can't run as fast as they can." Sometimes they blame everyone else for the problem. Even though they blame the other children they may still think of it as a problem they cannot change. Parents can help children by listening to them talk about the everyday joys and troubles that arise out of their friendships. Asking what might have led to others' reactions can help the child, with your assistance, to think of possible solutions. When problems arise in friendships it is important not to blame children but to show them how to find a solution. A problem-solving approach is often helpful.

1. Encourage the child to describe what has happened.
2. Ask about how they felt.
3. Ask them how they think the other person might see it and how they might be feeling.
4. Get them to think of ways they could do things differently next time.
5. Encourage them to try the new approach – get them to practise with you so they feel more confident.
- 6 Check back with your child to see how things turned out.

Thomas the tank engine

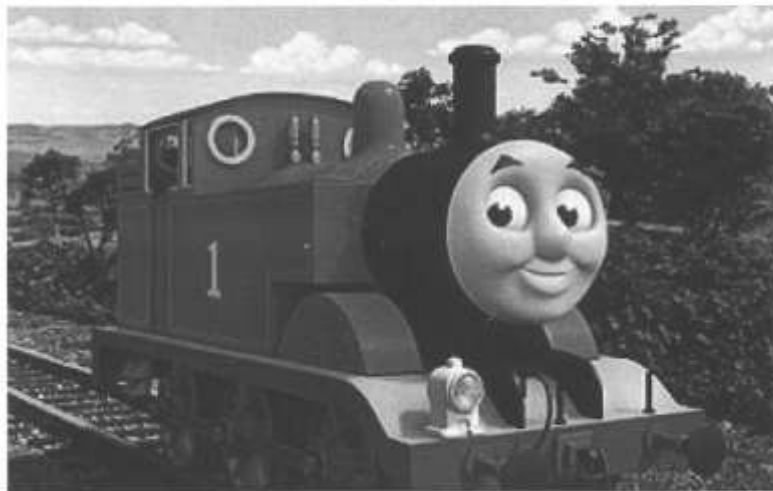

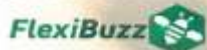
