Curriculum Day-Literacy and Numeracy

On Tuesday 13th March, all staff attended the professional development day facilitated by Caitlin McCormack and Jeremy Bodley. Caitlin focussed on the Daily 5 and CAFÉ framework which provides structure and effective strategies for teaching and learning independence in Literacy. Jeremy supported the teachers in developing a Karingal Primary School scope and sequence in the areas of Mathematics and aligning it into our K4 Maths model.

Teacher Professional Practice Days

In the Education State, we achieve excellence by consistently focusing on improving the achievements of learners across Victoria, whether it is through improving the quality of educational services or changing the way we teach. One of the most important things we can do to improve student outcomes is to develop and improve the skills of our teachers. What are Professional Practice Days?

As part of the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2017, teachers will receive one day per term when they are out of the classroom to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning.

What this means for your child.

Your child’s teacher will spend four days per year further developing their skills in areas that are aligned to the school priorities. Your child will directly benefit from these improvements in their daily learning.

On these days, an alternate teacher will assist your child with their learning needs. We are scheduling the professional practice days ahead of time so there is minimal impact to students and, where possible, there is consistency in teaching. Helping children with the ups and downs of friendships

Positive friendships help children have fun, and also help them cope during periods of stress and change.

Children's friendships often have their ups and downs. When friendships are going well they support children's emotional wellbeing and confidence, as well as providing someone to play with.

It is not always easy for children to know how to manage friendships. Problems with friends can affect how children feel about themselves and their enthusiasm for activities that involve others. Parents and carers can help children learn the kinds of friendship skills they will need as they grow and develop.

Learning how to make and keep friends involves a number of skills. Children learn more and more complex social skills from those around them as they develop. Home life has an effect on the development of social skills. A child who has an adoring little sister is likely to have more leadership skills. A child who is the little sister may be more used to fitting in with what others want to do. These children are likely to react differently when they go to school and meet other children with different life experiences and social skills.

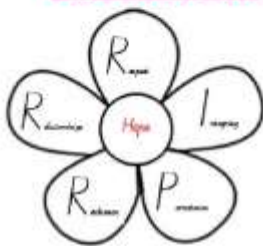
Student Wellbeing Team

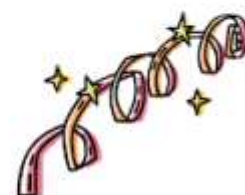

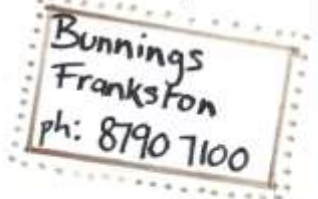
