### The Great Jellybean Guessing Game

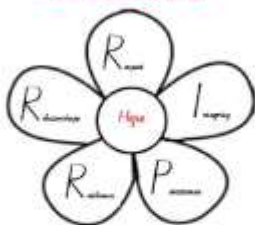
