CHRISTMAS CAROLS PICNIC

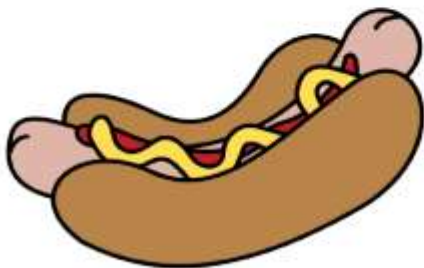


Monday 10th December 6.00pm on the Oval

The School Concert

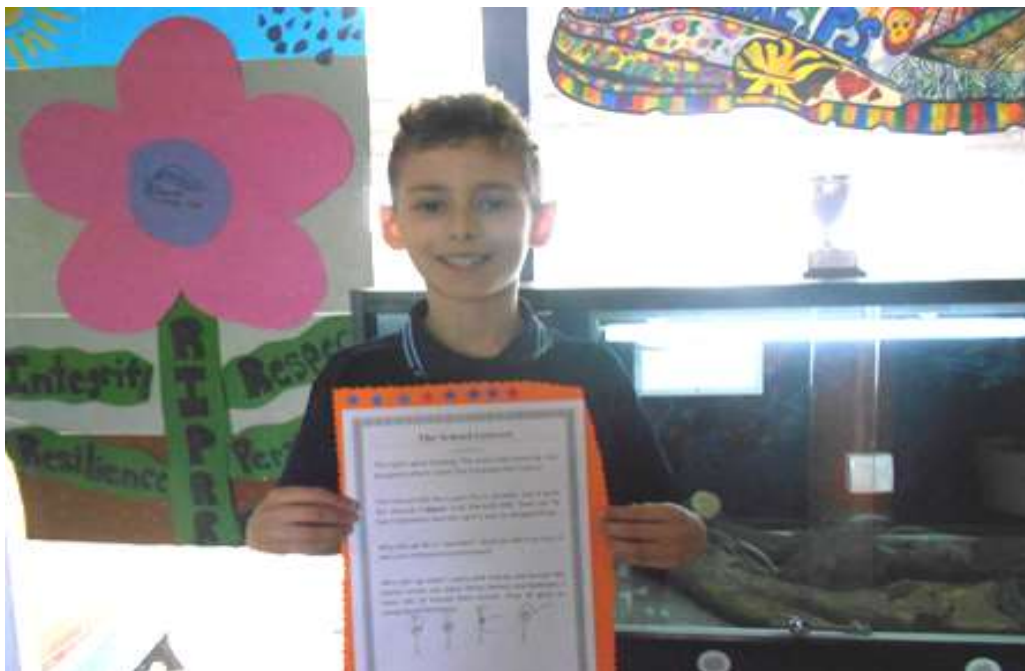


The children were fortunate to be entertained by the students of PMI keyboard in their concert. Thank you to James Pede (instructor) for organising the keyboard concert.

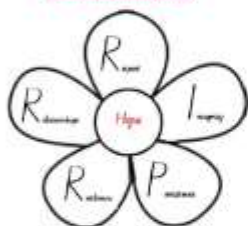


Christmas Concert Picnic
