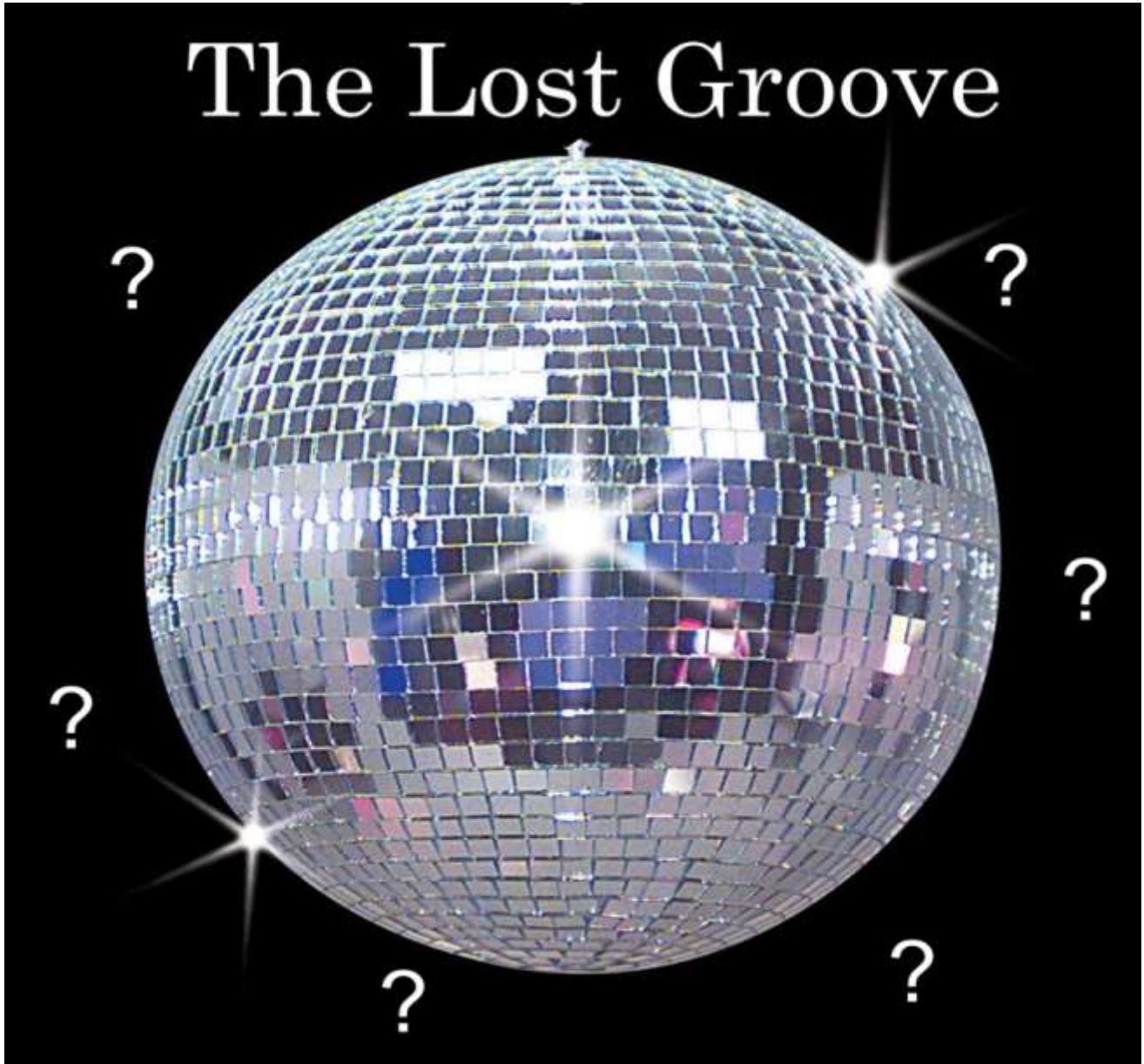

## Helping Children Learn Positive Friendship Skills

### Friendship patterns in the primary school years

Friends cooperate and communicate more with each other than with other children. They also have conflicts more often, but usually manage to settle them without upsetting the friendship. Friends influence each other's behaviour. Over time they may take on similar mannerisms, language and preferences. Although friendships usually have positive effects, friends who have behavioural problems may encourage problem behaviour in one another. As children's interests and developmental needs change, their friendship patterns may also change. By the middle of primary school it is common for children to form small friendship groups based around similar interests. These groups often establish their own rules about who can join them. Setting rules and learning to negotiate them is important for helping children to develop their understanding of social relationships. However, when children lack cooperative relationship skills it can lead to friendship groups being dominated by some children and excluding others.



### Play Leaders Training

On Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> July our 2018 RIPRR Team Leaders and our prospective leaders for 2019 participated in a 'PLAY Training' program with Resilient Youth Australia. The PLAY training day took place at our school and it allowed our RIPRR leaders to learn how to facilitate safe and fun games for our students during recess and lunch times throughout the year. 'PLAY' stands for Positivity, Leadership and Activated Youth. The program provides a platform for students to support each other, practice positive values, take responsibility and develop their leadership skills.



The day was fun and our students got to test out their new skills on our Prep and Grade 1 classes.

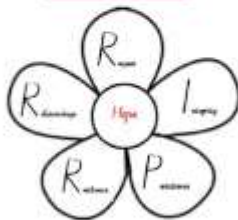
We were fortunate enough to receive a grant to cover the \$1650 program cost through School Focused Youth Services. Thank-you SYFS ☺

## 2018 Parent Opinion Survey

---

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> July** to **Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> August**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.
