My Child Is Having a Problem

Parents are reminded that dealing with student issues at school is the school's responsibility. Teachers and our Assistant Principal are experienced and skilled in handling these issues as they arise. In many instances a restorative chat with the students involved by the class teacher or the Assistant Principal or myself resolves the issue according to our school rules and in a timely fashion. We are asking for parent support in this regard and if your child comes home with an issue, please remember that they are telling you the story from their own perspective. Your responsibility is to handle it appropriately by letter us know as soon as possible. We will deal with it and communicate with you, so that you know that the matter has been dealt with. We have had a couple of instances recently where parents have approached other parents and students directly in the playground with the intent of resolving their own child's issue. This is and could result in your receiving an official warning and being prohibited from entering the school grounds. Thank you for your support and let us know via the communication channels outlined above, if your child is having a problem with something and needs extra support.

Years 3 - 4

Years 5 - 6

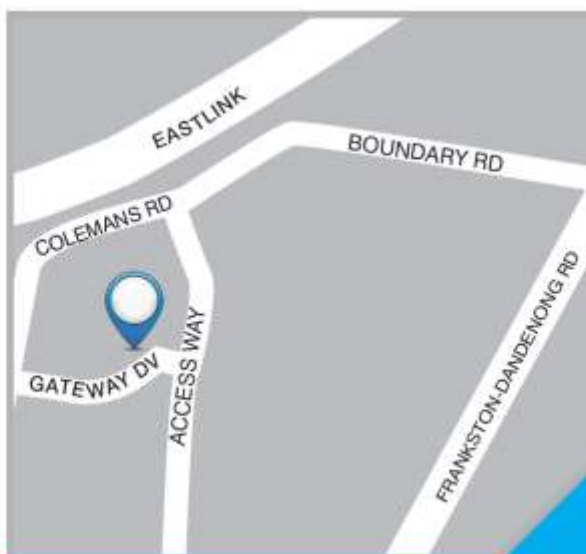

Key points for supporting children's friendship skills

All children go through friendship conflicts.

Parents, carers and school staff have important roles to play in helping children develop friendships

Be a coach

Coaching is critical for helping children use new skills in real-life situations. Coaching involves prompting, reminding and encouraging (but not nagging!) children to use the skills they have learned. Coach your child to practise positive social skills in everyday situations with family members and friends. Support children's learning by giving positive feedback and praise.

Help children solve friendship conflicts

Talking problems through with a supportive adult helps children to think about what happens, how they feel about it and what to do next. Thinking things through like this helps to build more mature social skills.

Buddy Bench

The Buddy Bench has been placed just outside the hall. If students are by themselves at recess or lunchtime, they simply walk over to the Buddy Bench and take a seat. A student or teacher will then take the appropriate action to engage with the child on the Buddy Bench and commence a conversation and remove the isolation that child has. The Buddy Bench gives children a focal point for better school community and better individual esteem removing negative feelings.
